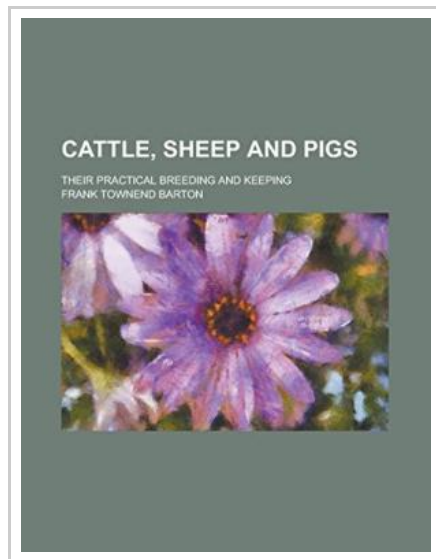

If it does, the best plan is to remove them with a pair of sharp scissors, but this again is work for the veterinary surgeon. Never apply liquid caustics to the eyelids, otherwise the eyesight will probably be injured. Tom Eyelids.--Injuries to the eyelids are not uncommon in cattle, and when such do occur, usually call for skilful treatment. A great deal, however, will depend upon the extent of the injury.
