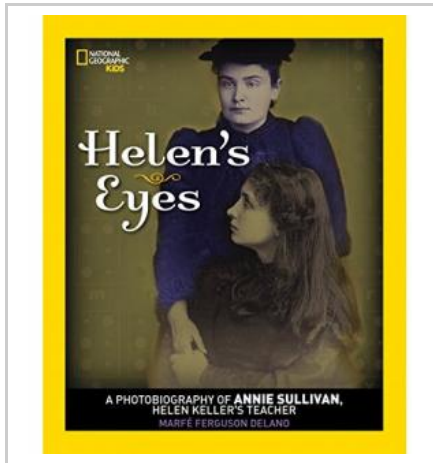




## Helen's Eyes: A Photobiography of Annie Sullivan, Helen Keller's Teacher (Paperback)
